Music Notes – Olivier Messiaën was one of the most influential French composers of the 20th century. His *Quatuor pour la fin du temps* (Quartet for the End of Time) ranks among his most popular works and was debuted by the composer and three fellow prisoners at a German prison camp in 1941. His *Verset* (1960), heard this morning, is composed of synthetic modes, plainsong and bird calls, an illustration of the composer's belief that music is intimately related to Nature, and thus to all of life. *Les Corps Glorieux* is a collection of seven brief visions inspired by apocalyptic scriptural citations, and reflecting the heart of the Christian faith. Life changes, but does not end with death.

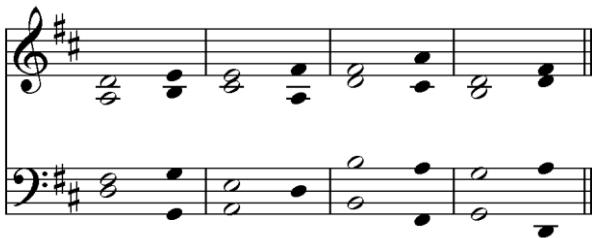
Collect of the Day


